# Talkin Tarn Permanent Orienteering Course

Welcome to the permanent orienteering course at Talkin Tarn Country Park. The car park is located at grid reference NY543590, nearest postcode CA8 1HN. The park is open 24 hours, but note there are parking charges between 10am and 6pm each day. There are toilets and a tearoom at the country park, opening times for which are on the Talkin Tarn website.

### Map

The orienteering map of Talkin Tarn Country Park is at a scale of 1:5000: one centimetre on the map is equivalent to 50 metres on the ground. The map is orientated to magnetic north with grid lines on the map spaced at 150m. At the bottom of the map is a legend showing the symbols and colours used for the map. Study the map carefully to find out the meaning of the symbols. These are special to the sport of orienteering and are consistent the world over, so as you learn this map you can apply it to other orienteering maps.

### What you need

You don't need any special clothing or equipment to experience the permanent orienteering course. Good shoes for walking or running would be sufficient. A pen would be good if you want to write down the codes you will find at each control.

#### **Controls**

There are 39 controls located within the country park. A control is shown on the map by a purple circle. The description for each control is on page 3 of this pack. At the control location there will be a small red & white marker attached to the side or back of a seat, post, fence post or telegraph pole, the marker having both the control number and a separate 2 letter code (as this example).



#### Courses

Use your map reading skills to navigate around the controls in the park. The start & finish are at the same place, just to the south of the tearoom building. There is no marked point on the ground, but on the map there is a combined triangle and double circle which represents this point. You can visit as many or as few controls you want in any order. Three suggested courses are shown on page 4 of this pack, gradually increasing in length and difficulty. We have included courses 1 to 3 at the back of the pack for you to print as needed. A "control card" also on page 4 allows you to write down the 2 letter code you will find on the marker at each control site. Alternatively you can simply write the code on the map adjacent to the control number.

## **Out in the Country Park**

Please take care when navigating around the course. Be respectful of the wildlife and other users of the park. Close any gates you may open. There may well be livestock in the fields to the west of the tarn so please keep dogs on a lead in this part of the park. A "Dogs on Lead Zone" has been implemented around the Tearoom, playground and Alex Boathouse area.

Neither Border Liners Orienteering Club nor the site managers can keep a constant eye on the area. Our aim is to check it at least once each year. 

#### **Control descriptions**

Each control is marked on the map with a purple circle. To assist locating the control marker each control has a description that helps to indicate more clearly what you are looking for. These are listed below for each control on the map:



Start & Finish: Building south side

20	Building, southeast corner	33	Seat	48	Earth wall, east end
21	Path, south side	34	Seat	49	Seat
22	Path junction	35	Hill top	50	Spur, northern part
23	Re-entrant	37	Telegraph pole	51	Hill top
24	Post	39	Depression	52	Path junction
25	Path bend, north side	40	Path, south side	53	Earthwall, southwest end
26	Fence, northwest corner	41	Small depression	54	Depression
27	Seat	42	Path, north side	55	Path junction
28	Hill top	43	Seat	56	Southeastern most tree
29	Fence, northwest corner	44	Seat	57	Tree
30	Path, south side	45	Hedge, southeast end	58	Telegraph pole
31	Seat	46	Seat	59	Path crossing
32	Path bend	47	Stile	60	Seat

#### **Courses**

Here are 3 suggested courses. Proceed round the course in sequence, returning to your starting point when finished. You may find it helpful to draw a line on the map linking the controls to visit.

- 1. Easy (approx. 2.1km actual distance) Start, 49, 43, 27, 60, 46, 34, 44, 33, 31, 59, Finish
- 2. Medium (2.7km) Start, 51, 52, 29, 27, 26, 24, 32, 55, 21, 40, 42, 20, Finish
- 3. Long (3.6km) Start, 42, 22, 39, 47, 48, 54, 56, 60, 45, 34, 23, 41, 30, 40, Finish

You can make your own course by combining controls in any order you like. The courses above do not visit all of the control sites in the park. One challenge might be to see how long it takes to visit all 39 controls.
