Changing Carlisle

Funding Boost

Carlisle has been confirmed as one of the 100 areas shortlisted for the £1 billion Future High Street Fund. The city has progressed to the second phase and will receive up to £150,000 to support the development of detailed project proposals.

Carlisle has also been included in the £3.6 billion Towns Fund and will receive up to £25 million to support further regeneration of the city centre. This funding will stimulate greater growth and investment in Carlisle, promoting the regeneration of the city centre and the wider area.

Free After Three

Free parking after 3pm, seven days a week, continues to be available in three Carlisle City Council car parks. The Free after 3pm scheme aims to support high street businesses in Carlisle by encouraging more visitors to park-up and discover the many city centre attractions, shops and places to eat.



The pilot scheme started on Thursday 1 August 2019 and will run until the end of March 2020. It provides around 1,000 free parking spaces after 3pm in Caldew Riverside: Castle: and Viaduct car parks, for all permitted vehicles.

On the build-up to Christmas the scheme will be extended to include other city centre car parks on Late Night Thursdays.

Free parking after 3pm will be available on the following Thursdays: 21 and 28 November and 5, 12 and 19 December in the following city centre car parks: Bitts Park; Caldew Riverside; Castle; Civic Centre; Lowther Street; Paddy's Market; The Sands Centre; Viaduct and West Walls.

FREE after 3pm

The Sands Centre

Work will soon get underway on the £25 million scheme at The Sands Centre. The major redevelopment of the leisure facility will include pools provision as well as significant improvements to the existing site.

The improvements will include a 25-metre x 17-metre eight lane main pool, a learner pool and a spectator seating gallery. There will also be four court sports halls, a 120-station fitness suite, dance studios, a spinning studio, an NHS Physiotherapy suite and improvements to the café and drinks areas.

Construction on The Sands Centre redevelopment will start this winter and is scheduled to be completed by summer 2021. The existing Pools provision on James Street will remain in place until all construction at The Sands Centre has been completed. Find out more at www.carlisle.gov.uk/sands-redevelopment





Carlisle Station Gateway

This summer, the Leaders of the Borderlands Councils and UK and Scottish Government Ministers signed an agreement setting out the projects and programmes in the Borderlands Inclusive Growth Deal. This has secured a £394.5 million investment package for projects in our region.

One of these projects is the Carlisle Station Gateway and Citadels proposal. It aims to create a new high-profile gateway development for Carlisle centred around the Railway Station, the Citadel buildings and Caldew Riverside. It aims to boost economic prosperity by attracting people to live, study and work in the area.

Local residents, businesses, commuters and visitors were recently given the opportunity to have their say on the first phase - ambitious new proposals for Carlisle Railway Station and its surrounding area.




Help us Recycle for Carlisle

Use one of your green bags for plastic and the other for paper, cardboard and food/ drinks cartons. Use your green box for tins, cans and glass.



- Check your collection calendar online and remember to put your containers out by 7am on your collection day. We will not return if you miss your collection.
- Please take your containers back onto your property the same day after collection.
- X In high winds, please do not leave containers out overnight. Please keep hold of your recycling until your next collection or use a local recycling site to reduce the risk of materials littering your streets.
- Please note, we CAN collect black plastic trays and clean foil trays (no tin foil).



Planning an Autumn Clear-out?

On the build-up to the festive season, we're encouraging Carlisle families to think about how they can reuse and recycle.

Before Santa arrives with new gifts, why not follow the lead of these local youngsters by sorting through toys and games and donating any unwanted items to a local charity? You can also donate new and quality used toys to children based at our Water Street accommodation. Either drop them off direct at Water Street or with the Homeless Prevention and Accommodation Services team at the Civic Centre. New toys and gifts for children and young people aged between 0-18 years old can also be donated to CFM Radio's Cash for Kids Mission Christmas.

If your autumn pre-Christmas clear-out also includes electrical items and/or furniture you can also donate these to Impact Furniture Services or other local charities. Visit www.carlisle.gov.uk/Residents/Binsand-Recycling/Reuse-Charities to find out more.

Please remember that we CANNOT collect Christmas wrapping paper for recycling. Wrapping paper is often shiny, dyed, laminated, glittery or plastic backed, and covered in sticky tape. None of these can be recycled. This also applies to glittery Christmas cards. Please place wrapping paper and the fronts of glittery cards into your refuse. Please remove the backs of glittery cards and place in your recycling.

Consider reusing materials to make Christmas items e.g. crackers, decorations, cards, or using a reusable gift bag instead of wrapping paper.

Local residents are being warned not to lose their right to vote by completing their annual canvass form and returning it to the City Council as soon as possible.

To make sure that you can take part in any future elections, the form needs to be completed and returned to the council's elections team.

It's important that residents respond as soon as possible, so we can make sure we have the right details on the electoral register for every address in Carlisle. To make sure you are able to have your say at elections, simply check the form when it arrives and respond as soon as you can. We have tried to make it is convenient as possible for people to register so you can respond via the registration website, by phone, by text or by returning the form by post.

If you're not currently registered, your name will not appear on the form. If you want to register, the easiest way is online at www.gov.uk/register-to-vote

People who have moved address recently are particularly encouraged to keep an eye out for the form and check the details.

Fairtrade Fortnight will be held between **Monday 24 February** and **Sunday 8 March 2020**. Carlisle became a Fairtrade City in 2005 and since then a team of dedicated volunteers oversees the running of the campaign and the renewal of Fairtrade city status, awarded by the Fairtrade Foundation, every two years, most recently in **July 2019**.

There are now more than 4,000 high quality products available in the UK from bananas and coffee to clothing and flowers, many of which are on sale in Carlisle. Independent Living Grants

Independent Living Grants are available to support Carlisle residents in their homes. The grants are non-means tested but require a report from a qualified health professional to confirm the resident's need for the adaptation.

The grants can be used for stairlifts, level access facilities, ramps or any other works to enable people to stay safe in their homes. The grant covers work up to $\pounds7,500$, minus a fee.

The grant is available for adults and children but does not cover general house maintenance. Since the introduction of the grant in **November 2018** we have helped an additional 45 households who would not previously have qualified for the traditional Disabled Facility Grants. Clean Air Day

As part of this year's Clean Air Day we reaffirmed our commitment to making the city a healthier place to live. We are actively working to improve the health of residents across the district and our support for Clean Air Day showed our commitment to making our district a better place to live. More than 100 school children entered with winning entries from Inglewood Infant School and Crosby-on-Eden CE Primary School. Help at Hand

Are you a home-owner? Do you have a chronic health condition or disability or on a low-income? Our Home Improvement Agency, Homelife Carlisle, can arrange for your gas boiler or fire to be serviced or repaired by a Gas Safe registered engineer.

Homelife Carlisle also has Discretionary Safe & Warm, Energy Efficiency and Dementia Friendly housing grants that can be used for improvements or safety work that make you more safe, warm and healthier in your own home.

Support is also available for local landlords to make their properties more energy efficient. New laws came into place in April last year. These aimed to encourage landlords to improve their properties' energy rating. From April 2020 properties that do not meet the standards will not be able to continue letting the property. Grants are available to eligible tenants for energy efficiency measures through our local ECO Help to Heat scheme and also towards heating including first-time gas central heating, mains gas connections, or LPG, oil or air-source heat pumps for rural properties through the Warm Homes Fund.


