Extra Care Housing Scheme Opens Bramble Court

Carlisle's first rural Extra Care housing scheme opens this winter. Bramble Court is managed by Impact Housing Association and provides sheltered housing that enables self-care and independent living within a supported environment. It is available for people aged 55 and over and priority is given to applicants with a local connection to the area.

The scheme has been developed in partnership with Carlisle City Council and the Brampton and Beyond Community Trust, who manage the adjacent community centre.

Care and support is tailored to individual requirements. Referrals can be made through Cumbria County Council's Adult Social care for people with higher support



needs and other vacancies are advertised through 'Cumbria Choice' at www.cumbriachoice.org.uk

Play Area Reopens

The Bitts Park play area has reopened and includes exciting new play equipment accessible for all abilities and ages. At the peak of the December 2015 floods, the play park was under eight feet of water and the contaminated water caused extensive damage. All the equipment and surfacing had to be removed. Rather than replacing like for like, we've taken the opportunity to rethink what play equipment we have and how we can make it more flood resilient. We have also installed wheelchair accessible play equipment.



Carlisle District Local Plan

The Carlisle District Local Plan has been approved and is now the masterplan for future development over the next 15 years.

The Plan has been consulted upon at every step of the way as it has emerged, responding to such consultations by refining and amending the policies and allocations within. We would like to thank all who have participated in the process and ultimately helped to shape the now adopted Plan.

Keep Warm this Winter



Homelife Carlisle has grants of up to £500 to provide preventative services that directly address the risks of death, injuries and illness caused by dangerous gas work and appliances. The following types of essential minor work may be carried out using the grant scheme funding: gas safety checks; gas servicing; gas boiler repairs; gas cookers; fires; gas pipework and water heaters. The grants are restricted to homeowners aged 60 or over who receive means tested benefit, who receive state pension only or who are disabled. Grants are also available for disabled home owners who are 21 years or over.

Health Through Warmth grants are also available and can be used to pay for new heating and home energy efficiency measures such as boilers, central heating, fires and insulation and draught-proofing as well as heating repairs on behalf of residents. To qualify applicants need to have a long-term, cold related illness made worse by cold living conditions due to inadequate heating or insulation and be on a low income (less than £25,000 per annum for single households and less than £32,000 for couples) and have less than £8,000 in savings. Health Through Warmth grants can fund up to 50% of costs and are normally up to £750.

Stamping out **Fly-Tipping**



If you have bulky household waste to dispose of such as white goods or furniture, this can be arranged by contacting customer services on 01228 817200. There is a charge of £20 for up to three items.

Clean and Green Carlisle

Residents are being reminded to dispose of their waste legally and responsibly. If you employ the services of a private waste collector you must take reasonable steps to ensure they are registered. Any authorised waste carrier will show you a certificate or authorisation card proving they are a registered carrier. Get a receipt and make a note of the registration number of the vehicle taking your waste. If you transfer your waste to an unauthorised waste carrier and the waste is then fly-tipped you may be prosecuted.

Fly-tipping is a serious criminal offence for which you can be prosecuted. We also now have powers to issue fixed penalty fines of up to £400 to those that have been caught fly-tipping and failure to pay will result in action being taken in the Magistrates Court. The courts have various powers available to them to tackle fly-tipping, including imprisonment, unlimited fines, orders to pay costs and any vehicle used could be seized. In the last 18 months, we had several successful prosecutions through the courts - for fly-tipping, litter and dog fouling offences - some resulting in fines of nearly £600.

If you see someone fly-tipping, send the following details to flytipping@carlisle.gov.uk

- Time, date and location of the incident
- Description of the: person/s involved (e.g. sex, height, age, build, etc), vehicle used (registration number, make and model, colour) and waste being fly-tipped (quantity and type of waste) e.g. approximately 20 bags of waste; garden waste, mattress etc.

- Books and shoes can be recycled at most supermarket recycling facilities.

Recovery to Resilience

Defences in Carlisle are now restored to provide protection to the level before Storm Desmond. The Government has allocated £72million to invest in flood defences across Cumbria with up to £25million for projects to reduce the flood risk in Carlisle. The Environment Agency and partners have been working hard to prepare for winter by repairing defences damaged by the December 2015 flooding. In Carlisle this includes:

- Tree clearance from Rivers Caldew, Eden and Petteril
- Little Caldew pumping station repairs
- Willowholme embankment repairs
- Parham Beck scour repairs
- Durranhill storage basin repairs
- Durranhill Pumping Station access and public safety repairs
- · Little Caldew channel repairs and debris removal
- Repairs around Little Caldew pumping station

Cumbria Floods Partnership

Alongside the Environment Agency's recovery programme, the Cumbria Floods Partnership was established so that communities and organisations could develop an action plan that considers how flood water can be managed along the whole length of the Eden catchment. from source to sea. Using a catchment approach, the flood risk will be reduced by delivering a number of actions including upstream management, improved defences, maintenance and resilience techniques. The first version of the Cumbria Flood Action Plan, including the Carlisle Community Plan is available at

- · Amendments to a flood control valve within Carlisle United FC's grounds
- · Willow Beck clearing channel and repairing damaged structures
- Strengthening of Botcherby Bridge
- 1,100 tonnes of gravel removed from Botcherby Bridge and Holme Head Weir
- Caldew Maltings replacement of lift up flood defences with permanent glass panel defences.

Flood Support

Property Resilience Grants

Grants of up to £5,000 are still available to homeowners and businesses that were flooded over 3 - 11 December 2015 or 24 - 28 December 2015.

The grant is available to fund measures which improve a household or business property's resilience or resistance to flooding. BERG, working on our behalf, is also helping flood affected property owners get quotes to install flood alleviation measures. They are available at the Civic Centre between Monday - Friday. 9am - 4pm. They can also be contacted on 01228 817002 or email floodgrants@carlisle.gov.uk

Part of the Property Resilience eligibility criteria allows flood affected property owners to get a qualified surveyor to assess their home/business and make a professional recommendation as to how the money is best used/ invested. £500 of the overall £5,000 can be claimed against that cost.

The end date for applications for both residential and business property applications has been extended to Friday 31 March 2017. To find out more, visit www.carlisle.gov.uk
