Homelife Carlisle is also promoting **FREE** gas safety grants including **FREE** gas boiler and fire servicing and **FREE** gas safety checks for eligible customers using funding from the Foundations Independent Living Trust Grant Scheme.

Grants of up to a maximum value of £500 can be awarded per beneficiary. The grants are restricted to home owners who are 60 years or over and disabled home owners who meet certain criteria.

The offers are available until **Tuesday 31 March 2015**.

We also can offer Health Through Warmth grants towards the cost of heating and insulation for homeowners who have a health condition subject to eligibility.

Have a Green Christmas



- If you have a **Greenbox**, you can recycle the following items at the kerbside or at a local recycling point: wrapping paper; Christmas cards; clean and empty glass bottles and jars; clean and empty drinks and food cans; empty aerosol cans.
- You can recycle your real Christmas tree using your **Garden Waste** bin (place it beside the bin, on the day of your collection, if it is too big to go inside). In the New Year, to help speed up your garden waste collections please do not place your garden waste bin out for collection unless it is at least half full.
- If you have **Greenbags** you can recycle the following items from the kerbside or from recycling points: cardboard food and packaging boxes (please place beside your cardboard bag if it will not fit in); hard plastic packaging; plastic bottles, plastic biscuit trays and other plastic trays/food tubs. Please put plastics in one bag and cardboard in the other as we cannot recycle mixed bags.

Recycling tips

- If you have a greenbox, please stack your clean paper to the bottom/side of your box or place the heavier items on the paper to stop it blowing away.
- Get a **FREE** cover for your greenbox from Carlisle City Council's Customer Contact Centre.
- Please use a recycling point if you don't have access to all our kerbside recycling schemes and don't dump waste at the recycling sites. This creates fly tipping and unnecessary waste.
- Please make sure you don't place any non-recyclable items into the banks as this contaminates all the contents. Materials such as polystyrene cannot be recycled and should be placed into your household refuse container.

Refuse tips

- If you have a gull-proof sack, please don't put waste in loose. Please make sure it's put in a refuse bag.
- Don't put extra refuse bags next to your wheeled bin or gull-proof sack. This is 'side waste' and attracts gulls and other pests.

Bulky waste tips

- If you're getting large items collected, make sure it's collected by a licensed waste collector. If not, you could face a substantial fine if they dump the waste.
- Clean reusable household furniture and electrical items can be donated to Impact Furniture Services in Carlisle (a social enterprise). Telephone **01228 633655**.
- You can take these items for disposal free of charge to Cumbria County Council's Household Waste Recycling Centre on Rome Street, Carlisle (open 8am to 6pm daily) or Townfoot Industrial Estate, Brampton (open 10am to 6pm Wednesday to Monday inclusive).
- We will also collect bulky items for a charge of £18 for up to five items. To arrange a collection please email customerservices@carlisle.gov.uk or telephone **01228 817200**.

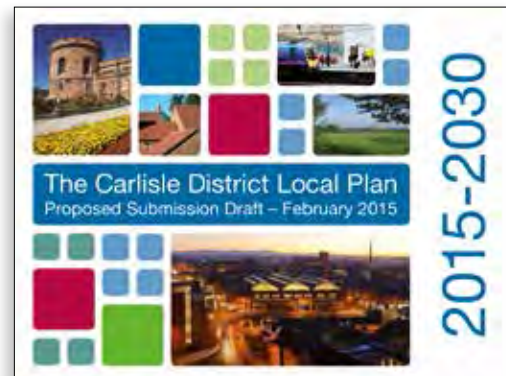

Memorial Repairs

Carlisle memorials were spruced up in time for the centenary of the beginning of the First World War. The memorials, which include stone crosses, plaques, crucifixes and tablets, were put in place in tribute to those who gave their lives in service of their country during the war. The major part of the project involved restoration work to the Cumberland and Westmorland war memorial - the Rickerby Park Cenotaph. The grade II-listed memorial, which was funded by the Carlisle Citizens' League in 1922, is now looked after by the City Council. The restoration work was partially funded by the War Memorials Trust.
