5.	Discussion of partner Action Plans relating to the delivery of new housing City Council staff will contact each partner to collate an action plan. ST gave an overview of Carlisle City Council's Housing Strategy, which should be completed by September 2011. RL – The Carlisle Strategy should feedback into the Cumbria HS. The Cumbria HS is informing the next Local Investment Plan (LIP). CH highlighted that the City Council's growth agenda did not feature prevalently enough in the original LIP. On the growth point – CH stated that a report is going to committee on using the Regional Spatial Strategy (RSS) figures as the Council's interim housing requirements. 	consultants working with the Council, has spent three days in	
	the district interviewing stakeholders.	
7.	Housing Delivery: breaking down the barriers	
	As part of the Council's stakeholder consultation, Chris	
	Broughton led a discussion on breaking down the barriers to	
	housing delivery. Discussion touched on:	
	 Attracting more 'executives' to the area – the issue is 	
	not just that of quality housing, but part of a wider	
	quality of life.	
	The current will of developers to invest in new	
	housing	
	Buyers struggling with obtaining mortgages	
	 PH stated that show rooms are seeing an 	
	influx of visitors	
	 GD/AMW – Housing Associations resisting 	
	shared ownership options as mortgages aren't	
	available	
	Housing sites in the pipelines	
	 CH highlighted that many approved, unbuilt 	
	housing schemes are on brownfield sites (as	
	encouraged in the Local Plan).	
	 Rural Housing – local service centre planning 	
	boundaries may be forcing increases in house prices	
	The new Affordable Housing Programme and the	
	impact of Affordable rent	
	- JW gave an update on AHP – by 20 th June, HCA will	
	be speaking to LAs about priorities. Where local	
	authorities are making land available for the AHP,	
	this should be at nil/reduced value. Commuted sums	
	are another option.	
	 The New Homes Bonus – both the City Council and 	
	the County Council must decide on what to spend the	
	NHB monies on.
