- A 15-month package of support to develop their income generating idea.
- Access to funding of up to £10,000.

Launch of £30m 5G Supply Chain Future Radio Access Network Competition

Consortia of tech and telecoms innovators can access funding for projects that aim to turn the UK into a leading global destination for developing the next generation of 5G networks. **The deadline for applications is Tuesday 27 August 2021.**





Children, Young People & Families

Funding for grassroots youth organisations based in England which have suffered in the wake of the COVID-19 pandemic.

The Covid Resilience Fund is provided through a partnership between the Julia and Hans Rausing Trust and UK Youth. Grants of up to £50,000 will help facilitate the reopening and continuation of youth provision to pre-pandemic levels. The grant can be spent on essential business expenditure that will be incurred between 1 August 2021 and 31 January 2022, such as staff salaries and fixed/operational costs. **Applications will be accepted from Thursday 1 July 2020 to Sunday 18 July 2021 (midnight)**.



Communities - Urban & Rural Development

Places Called Home Fund - Application deadline: Wednesday 14 July 2021

Grants are available for small, local voluntary and community groups and organisations and schools to help improve community shared spaces and run activities that focus on sustainable living in the UK. **Application deadline is Wednesday 14 July 2021**.

The funding is intended for a range of notfor-profit organisations that can meet at least two of the following criteria:

 Build on the relationships created during the COVID-19 pandemic to increase community activity and the number of people taking part.

- Encourage people to work together, creating opportunities for communities to live in a sustainable and healthy way.
- Raise awareness amongst the public of the importance of connected households, neighbourhoods and resilient communities.
- Develop a new idea, activity or way to come together that has emerged in response to the pandemic.
- Revive or redesign community and common spaces to encourage shared community activities.

Projects from schools or an organisation working in a school need to strengthen the community outside of the school too. It should benefit and involve more than just teachers, pupils and parents of pupils.

Grants are available for projects that aim to accelerate the adoption of renewable energy and low carbon technologies.

Grants are usually for between £5,000 and £50,000. **The next application deadline is Monday 19 July 2021**. To be eligible, projects should fall into one of the following themes:

- Education, skills and CPD.
- Public awareness/information and consumer confidence.
- Zero carbon planning.
- Local zero carbon delivery initiatives.

Launch of the Green Heat Network Fund Transition Scheme

Capital grants for public, private and third sector organisations in England to support the development of low and zero carbon heat networks. **The deadline is Thursday 12 August 2021 (12.00 BST)**.

Support is still available from the Joint Sports Hardship Fund
