Carlisle Foodies Fest

Clean and Green Carlisle

Improvements to your Recycling Collection Service

From **12 June 2017** we are extending our kerbside recycling service to more properties and are asking everyone to sort their recycling slightly differently. We may also be asking some of you to put your bins, bags and boxes out on a different day.

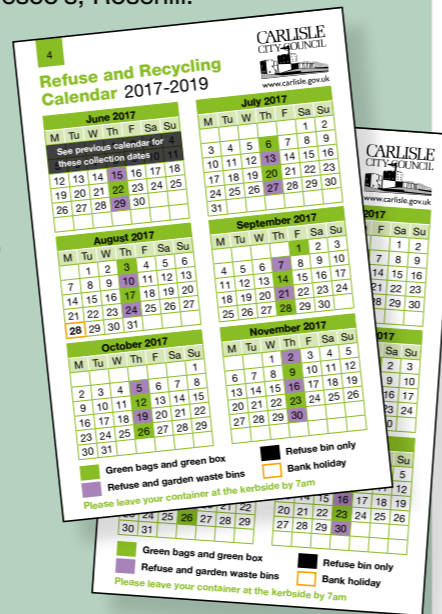
Please check your new collection calendar (delivered to all households in May) to confirm the day of the week to put your refuse, garden waste and recycling out for collection.

From **12 June onwards**, please put your paper into a green bag with your cardboard. You can now also place empty food and drink cartons e.g. tetrapak into the same bag. Please put your plastic into a separate green bag - do not mix with your paper, cardboard and cartons. Use your green box for your tins, cans and glass only. Turn to pages eight and nine to find out more.

Keep Carlisle Clean

New dog poo bag dispensers are now available in two areas within Carlisle. Two dispensers have been installed - one in Denton Holme and another in Stanwix. The trial is as part of our Keep Carlisle Clean campaign with the aim of extending it to other areas of the district. The signage includes a strong message to irresponsible dog owners and warns them that they could be fined if they do not 'bag and bin' their dog's waste. Please remember to always bring along plenty of bags when you're walking your dog, but if you do need them, pick up a free dog poo bag from a dispenser.

We are urging local residents and businesses to back our campaign to Keep Carlisle Clean. We want to work alongside local communities to tackle anti-social behaviour such as graffiti, litter, dog fouling, fly-tipping and fly-posting. Talkin Tarn Play Area

Work is underway on a new and improved play area at Talkin Tarn.

Aimed at children up to 12 years old, the play equipment includes a main feature located in a large sand pit, together with sand play items, a slide and a wooden dinghy. All equipment is constructed from natural materials and is designed to harmonise with the natural environment of Talkin Tarn. Each piece of equipment is tactile and uniquely designed to allow children to play according to their abilities and help develop their co-ordination, balance and confidence.

Stray Dogs

We operate a 24 hour stray dogs service and take every step we can to return stray dogs to their owners. We check to see if they are micro-chipped and if contacted by the owners, attempt to reunite them with their dog as quickly as possible. There is a charge for the return of your dog.

If we are unable to reunite dog and owner we will take the dog to the kennels. Dogs must be claimed within seven days. Unclaimed dogs may be re-homed.

Dog wardens can be contacted:

- **Monday - Friday**, 8am - 5pm contact **01228 817399**.
- **Monday - Friday**, 5pm - 8am, plus 24 hours at weekends and bank holidays, contact **07909 382092**.

It is now a legal requirement for ALL dogs to be micro-chipped and contact details kept up-to-date. You can be fined up to £500 if your dog isn't micro-chipped or your dog's details aren't up to date. Your dog's micro-chip must be fitted by a trained professional, for example a vet.



Pest Control

We provide public health pest advice and treatment for domestic properties. We carry out treatments by appointment only; please visit www.carlisle.gov.uk to book an appointment for services for ants, mice, rats and wasps. For commercial premises or other pests please phone **01228 817559**.

These are normally carried out during office hours. We can also offer early mornings or late afternoon appointments during weekdays (not including bank holidays). Fees are payable at the time of booking.

Gull Prevention

Spring is the time of year when gulls start to breed and nest and many of the large shallow pitched roofs provide ideal nesting opportunities. Typically a breeding pair of gulls will lay three eggs which hatch around late June and July. Do not feed gulls or drop food waste on pavements. If you do, you could be fined. Also ensure that any food waste is correctly stored to prevent the gulls accessing it and then attracting other types of vermin. Landowners are being asked to check their land for nesting gulls. News Round-Up

Cracker Packer Statue

A Cracker Packer statue is planned for Caldewgate, Carlisle. Hazel Reeves, an award-winning artist, will create the artwork depicting two McVitie's factory workers.

The art installation will have strong connections to McVitie's and will be based close to the biscuit factory. Privately funded, the bronze statue will depict two women workers - one from past times and one from the modern day dressed in their respective factory uniforms. The two 'Cracker Packers', the name given to workers at the (then-named) Carr's biscuit factory, will be situated next to Paddy's Market car park on John Street, Carlisle.

The Cracker Packers will be standing on a bronze Carr's Table Water biscuit, with the distinctive Carr's signature logo embossed into it. The unveiling of the statue is planned for International Women's Day on **8 March 2018**. With the support of pladis and Carlisle Archives, Hazel is working with current and former Cracker Packers to develop the statue (see right).

Harraby Cycle Circuit

Construction work is underway on a new closed road cycle circuit in Harraby, Carlisle. Supported by British Cycling, it will be a 1km long, 6 metres wide, tarmac surfaced circuit. It will form part of the Harraby Community Campus and will be available for all ages and abilities to use for training, recreation and competitive cycling. Once completed, the purpose built cycle circuit will be the only one of its kind in Cumbria. The outdoor facility is being built on land behind Harraby Community Campus and will provide a traffic-free place for cyclists of all ages and abilities to ride, train and compete. The circuit will be lit and fenced, with designated spectator areas.

The Harraby Community Campus includes a variety of facilities including a community centre, café, and a 250-seat theatre. Sports facilities at the campus also include new football pitches and changing rooms. The campus was funded by Cumbria County Council and Carlisle City Council.

Disabled Facility Grants



If you need to make changes to your home, to provide a safer environment for yourself or a family member, then we might be able to help you. Disabled Facility Grants (DFGs) are available to pay for adaptations to support people with disabilities to live more independently in their homes such as stairlifts, level access showers and ramps. The maximum grant available is £30,000. Means testing applies in certain cases, but this excludes aids and adaptations for children and those receiving some benefits.

As part of this process, we need to obtain a report from an Occupation Therapist (OT). Since January, an additional service is available outside of Cumbria County Council Adult Social Care system. Customers can now access the private OT service, within a quicker turn around and reduced waiting times for DFG customers. Contact us at **01228 817320**.

News in Focus

Housing Grants

Two new discretionary housing grants are now available through Homelife Carlisle Home Improvement Agency. The grants aim to assist home owners to have: increased independence; safety and to minimise the effects of disability and poor health; to enable carers to continue care; and prevention of admission to more institutionalised care and to hospital.

Minor Measures Grants: grants up to the value of £500 are available for minor measures to support good health. The following types of works are eligible for a grant: key-safes, deep-clean to the property and gas boiler & fire servicing. You need to be a home owner to apply and

- are in receipt of disability benefits such as PIP, DLA or ESA
- OR be in receipt of a means-tested benefit
- OR have a gross annual household income of less than £25,000
- OR require the works to assist with hospital discharge.

Safe and Warm Grants: grants of up to £7,500 are available to enable low income home owners to carry out a range of home repairs and energy efficiency measures to make their homes safer and warmer. The following types of works will be considered for a grant: cavity wall and loft insulation; electrical work to make homes safer; draught-proofing including glazing; new heating systems; heating repairs and replacements; and private water supply issues. Low income home owners can apply, including those:

- In receipt of a disability benefit OR
- In receipt of a means-tested benefit OR
- over 50 years of age.

Help to Develop a Community Emergency Plan

What would you do in an emergency? Do you have a plan for yourself, your family? How about your friends and neighbours? Would you like to know how to help others in your community?

In aftermath of the 2015 flooding, communities across Cumbria have been joining together to create Community Emergency Plans. These plans allow local communities to develop a series of actions that let members of the community provide support and help each other when an emergency happens.

ACTion with Communities in Cumbria (ACT) is part of a three year project called Rebuilding Together and is funded by the Big Lottery. The project helps communities develop their own Community Emergency Plans. They can offer support to groups and individuals who would like to consider developing a Community Emergency Plan.

These plans can be as simple as neighbours agreeing to check on each other when something happens, perhaps extreme cold weather or they could be organised groups of volunteers warning and informing residents in the event of flooding. How detailed or simple the plan is, is up to you as a community.

Heather Askew has worked with her community in Keswick to build their community plan, she supports a large group of volunteers who are willing to help their friends and neighbours in the event of another large scale emergency.

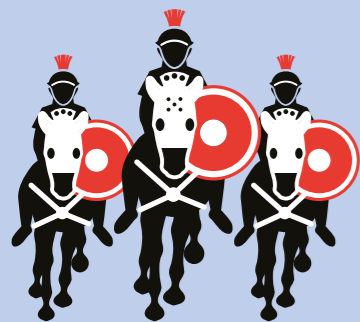
Hadrian's Cavalry Exhibition



At Tullie House discover how the Cavalry was organised and the crucial role it played in Carlisle, across the wall and throughout the whole Roman Empire.
