Priority Services Register	Help you can get through the Priority Services Register:  HOME OWNERS Suppliers provide free gas safety checks (e.g. for appliances such as a gas boiler) for homeowners and are available once every 12 months. You are eligible for this service if you are in receipt of a meanstested benefit  ALL HOMES If you register as a priority services customer, you may be eligible for free services including:  • Advance notice of planned power cuts. • Priority support in an emergency. This could involve your local network operator providing alternative heating and cooking facilities in the event of supply interruption. • Identification scheme. This is to reassure you that callers, for example meter readers, are genuine.	Who can sign up to the Priority Services Register? If you have a different supplier for your gas and electricity, you need to contact them both. If you switch supplier, you'll need to register for the service again with them.
