Targeted Delivery of ECO Measures</p> <p>Following a procurement exercise, Carlisle City Council aims to work with NPower to deliver ECO funding to homes within the District to meet the priorities identified in the District. Actions, success measures and timescales will be reported once these are agreed.</p> <p>2. Energy Supply Partnership</p> <p>The City Council’s Executive have approved a recommendation to procure an energy supply partner to reduce fuel poverty and make homes more affordable to heat in the District.
