Campsite Additional Information

- The Campsite can hold approx 25 x 2 man tents
- There are 3 water taps on the field and a cold water dish-washing area
- There is a fully accessible toilet block that also contains 3 showers (1x male/1x female and 1 x disabled)
- A further block of changing rooms can be made available if extra showers are required. (2 x male and 2 x female showers)
- A log cabin can be hired for a meeting space (see below)
- Catering can be provided by the tearoom if required.
- There is a campfire area, please supply your own wood. Please do not use wood found around the woodlands of Talkin Tarn.
- Please leave the site as it is found.
- All fire extinguishers are located in the green container located next to the campsite. It is the responsibility of the group leaders to pull out the fire trolley on arrival and put away on departure. Please inform site manager if extinguishers are used. The code for the combination padlock of the container will be sent out with the confirmation of booking e mail.

Rules

1. No noise after 11pm.
2. All fire extinguishers are located in the green container located next to the campsite. It is the responsibility of the group leaders to pull out the fire trolley on arrival and put away on departure. Please inform site manager if extinguishers are used. Codes for the container padlock are provided in your booking confirmation email.
3. No loud music.
4. Site must be left free of litter. Please use the bins/bags provided.
5. Strictly no smoking in any of the site buildings.
6. No firearms of any description may be used on site.
7. The discharge of fireworks is strictly prohibited.
8. Dogs to be kept under close control and under no circumstances to be let onto neighbouring fields which are privately owned.
9. This site is covered by the Dog Fouling of Land Act. All dog poo must be scooped and put in bins.
10. No fires except in designated areas.
11. Please do not collect any firewood from the woodlands. All firewood for the firepit must be brought in.
12. No vehicles are to be driven onto the campsite. Parking is provided next to the campsite.
13. No dishwashing in the toilets or changing rooms or log cabin. Use the sink provided in the campsite.
14. For washing of persons use only the changing rooms or showers provided. (Toilets are also used by members of the public and thus washing in these sinks is inappropriate).
15. Please have consideration to other users of the Country Park at all times.
16. Water is metered so please turn off taps after use.
17. The adjoining fields to the campsite are privately owned and should not be entered.
18. No equipment or furniture to be taken out of the buildings without prior permission.
19. No generators to be used without prior permission.
20. Camp only in the designated camping field.
21. Group leaders are responsible for the group members at all times.
22. Tents to be adequately spaced (6m) to reduce fire risk and risk of trips and falls.
23. Cooking stoves and BBQ's can be used but should have any hot surfaces raised up from the ground. Stones are provided for this purpose.
24. You are advised not to light stoves in tents due to the high fire risk.

Information

25. Groups should bring own suitable first aid kits.
26. Access to a phone for emergency purposes is only available during tearoom opening hours, 10.30 – 4.00 p.m. Leaders should bring mobile phones for out of hours use. However be aware that mobile reception is very poor at Talkin Tarn. Use 112 from a mobile in an emergency.
27. We reserve the right to ask your group to leave the site and make good any damage caused.
28. Your deposit is non-returnable even if there are adverse weather conditions.
29. No lights are provided on the campsite. It is advised to bring a torch for night time.
30. Please note members of the public are able to access the campsite area on foot at night.
31. All accidents/injuries/near misses to people buildings or equipment should be reported to the site manager.
